



Fulton County prides itself on providing residents with the best quality of life services of any county in the state. The largest hospital in the State of Georgia, Grady Memorial Hospital, is funded by Fulton and is considered to be one of the premier public hospitals in the Southern United States. Fulton County's Health & Wellness Department has a

workforce of more than 700 health care professionals and operates 8 health centers around the county, providing services for more than 350,000 visits annually.
