South Fulton HOA Alliance (SFHA) provides an opportunity for homeowner associations throughout the South Fulton area to address common challenges like financial management, community apathy, governance, and collections. Through sharing of resources and knowledge from subject matter experts, SFHA empowers HOA boards and residents alike to protect their rights and avoid making decisions in isolation.

Friends of Wolf Creek Amphitheater (FOWC) works to enhance the Wolf Creek Amphitheater and surrounding communities. To promote cultural diversity through the use of arts and entertainment.

Georgia HOA Alliance (GHA) is a coalition of homeowner associations throughout Georgia. GHA helps homeowners in the State of Georgia with training for elections, governance, and transition. Statewide standards to govern HOAs and their boards and to protect Georgia homeowners.

Friends of South Fulton Parks and Recreation (FSFPR) aims to educate and promote youth sports and healthy lifestyles through parks and recreation centers located in South Fulton.
